A table will be set up in the atrium with quilt show information at the September guild meeting. Pick up your baggies with information on how to label your quilts and bags. An quilt entry list will be on hand for you to get your quilt numbers and row letters for each quilt entered. We will be there to answer any questions you may have.

Quilt Show Volunteers Needed!

Because the show can't be successful without everyone's help, the guild has a requirement that each member must work at least two hours in some capacity. The show has 200 volunteer slots to be filled and at this point we have 75% of them filled. If you do the math, we also need members to volunteer for more than one slot if their schedules allow. "Floaters" are especially valuable as they allow us flexibility to assign people to where they are most needed. A MILLION THANKS to those who have already signed up!

To sign up, use the Volunteer Signup link under the Quilt Show tab on our website. It will take you to the Sign-Up Genius app where you can see what slots are still open as well as who is working when. I'll also have sign-up sheets at our meeting. If you need help signing up or you cannot volunteer due to time constraints or other issues, email me and we can work out a solution.

All volunteers are admitted to the show for free no matter what day they work or what day they attend the show. When you come to the church for your volunteer shift, be sure to sign in at the Admissions table and pick up your Volunteer Favor. Also remember to wear your nametag at all times during the show. MVQ members are "ambassadors" for our guild.

I am happy to announce we will be offering a monthly mystery quilt program again this program year. We have received permission from a local designer to use one of their patterns. The designer and pattern name will be provided in the last set of instructions.

The pattern is a traditional pieced pattern. There are no y seams, applique, half square triangles or flying geese but it does call for snowball corners on some of the pieces. The finished size is about 57 by 70 inches.

Each month, starting at the September meeting, a set of instructions will be available if you would like to participate. After the meeting, the instructions will be uploaded to the guild website for those who were unable to attend the meeting. We would like to have a show and tell of everyone's quilt top or finished quilt at the June meeting.

Quilt Show - Jamie Ruh - everyone has an info sheet about the quilt show to take home. Please consider entering your Mystery Quilts in the quilt show. Ribbons may be given. Bring comfort quilts to set-up day. Stephanie Dinunzio from Community Giving Tree will receive them in October. We will have a scissor sharpener both days, so bring your scissors or tools that need sharpening. Mary Lou Monteiro is collecting fat quarters and lottery tickets for the Penny Raffle. In September, baggies with quilt labeling information will be available. Make sure your quilt has a 5" sleeve on it. Kim Schweisberg volunteered to bring posters to Newburyport businesses.

Entry forms - Liz Swan - deadline for quilt entries is August 1st. 24 quilts have been entered so far. Entry forms are on the table, online, and on the website. Please consider getting your quilt judged. If you need to change anything on your entry form after you have submitted it, send the new information to Liz Swan. Mail judging fees to the PO Box, or pay by PayPal online after your entries are filled out.
